GOSPEL READING Luke 2: 1-20

Our Christmas Eve story comes from the Gospel of Saint Luke. In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. To us is born a Savior.
